

British African Resources brings Nigerian Delegation to Anglesey On Wednesday 21 March 2012



British African Resources, a project development company specialising in West Africa hosted Mrs Meg Okirie, the esteemed delegate of Chief Oris U. Onyiri, President General of the Egi Peoples Assembly from Rivers State in the Niger Delta region of Nigeria, during a factory inspection visit to Anglesey on Wednesday 21 March. Mr Armand Leblois (pictured below) of Total Oil Nigeria accompanied Mrs Okirie to the factory.

Chief Oris, in partnership with Total Oil are hoping to use equipment built in Anglesey to process Palm Oil in the Egi Kingdom. David McKechnie of British African Resources (pictured left with Mrs Okirie), the project leader, believes this could be the first of many Welsh built palm oil mills to go into the Niger Delta.

Chief Oris’s Kingdom has a large, land based Total oil rig, which dominates the landscape of the area. Total Oil are providing funds for the Egi people to invest in a sustainable future for the Kingdom.
